Who We Are

Our History

In 2000, a small group of Somerset County citizens recognized a demand in the community for services related to the care, management, and treatment of domestic animals. Because of this growing need, they came together to form a cohesive network of individuals and systems that would effectively address these public concerns.

The Humane Society of Somerset County, a private, 501c 3 non-profit organization was established. The Society's mission is to prevent cruelty to animals, promote respect for their intrinsic value, eliminate pet overpopulation and enhance the bond between humans and animals


Every year the Society receives hundreds of calls for help. We have assisted in the adoption and transfer of hundreds of animals, working with other rescue groups and local officials through direct adoptions to families, and have coordinated the rescue and rehabilitation of dozens of abused animals.

We are working towards finding loving homes and fulfilling lives for all the animals in Somerset County.

Serving the Animals

Foster/Adoption Program

Since its inception, the Society has used a Foster care network system to place animals into temporary homes until we can find permanent placement for them. The Society provides any vet care, including spay or neuter surgeries for all animals in our foster care system. We then advertise for forever homes for the animals, using our website, petfinder.com, showing at public places and advertising in the newspaper.



Rescue Program

We respond daily to phone calls and emails from Concerned citizens. Ranging from lost pets to suspected cases of animal cruelty, we work with local enforcement agencies to document and intercede in these instances of animal mistreatment. We then supervise the care and rehabilitation of these animals. We are an integral member of the team and significant resource for the community in the rescue and care of companion animals in the county.

Serving the Community

Outreach and Education

One of our goals is to increase awareness about issues facing companion and feral animals in our community. We work with the media to inform the public about current issues and abuse cases. We participate in community events and meetings, offer educational brochures and presentation to community organizations and schools, and testify before government agencies in support of humane legislation.

Reproductive Control

The Society is committed to confronting the issue of animal overpopulation in our community. We are working to establish and maintain long-term animal reproduction control initiatives. We address the issue of feral colonies by trapping, sterilizing, and releasing the animals where we are sure they will be safe and receive proper care. Partnering with local veterinarians, we conduct regular low-cost spay/neuter programs. Our mobile spay/neuter unit has been up and running since the summer of 2008, and is currently serving all of Somerset County.
